# PERMIT & LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

When do you need a state permit or license?

Vermont Fire and Building Safety Code section 7 (a) The owner, or a designated representative, of a building or premises shall obtain a construction permit before beginning any construction, addition, alteration, demolition or installation of fixed building equipment at the building site unless specifically waived by the AHJ
